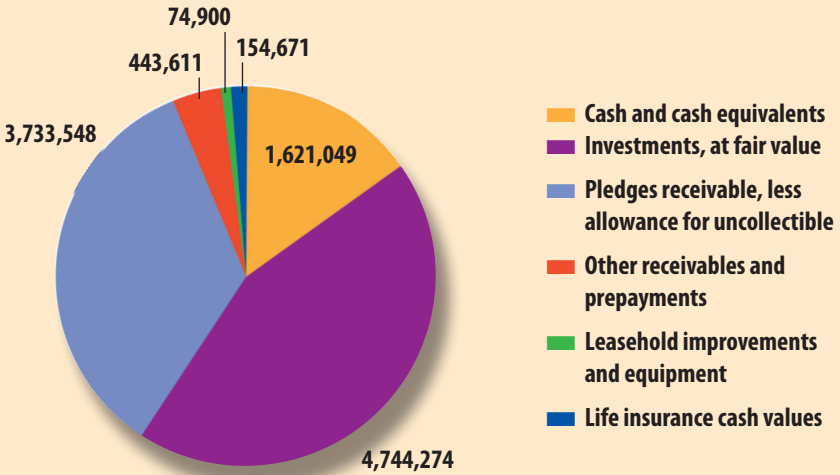

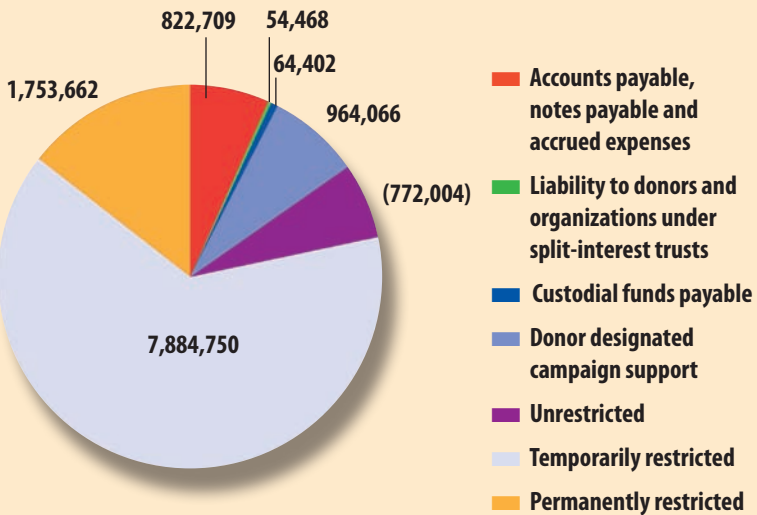

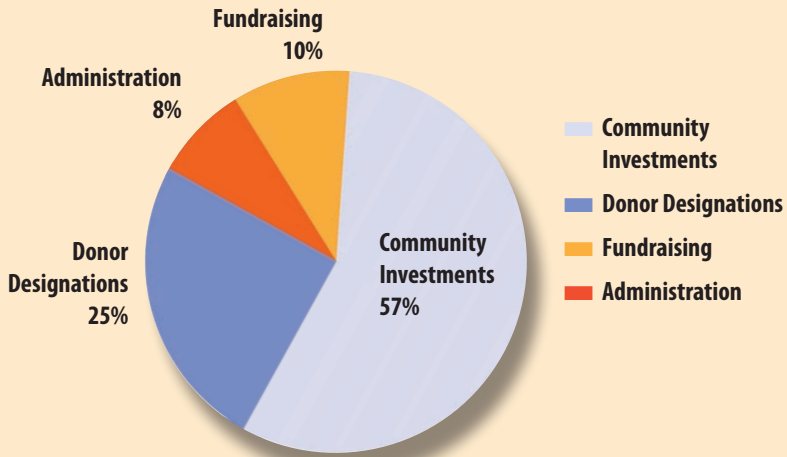
LIABILITIES & NET ASSETS
