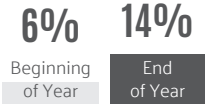

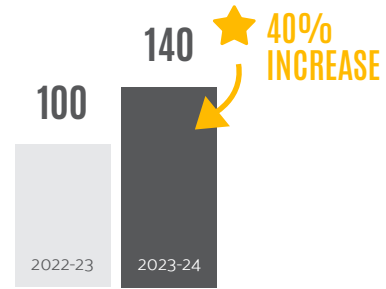

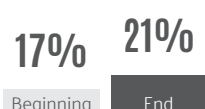

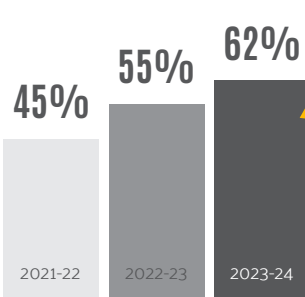


STUDENT ATTENDANCE

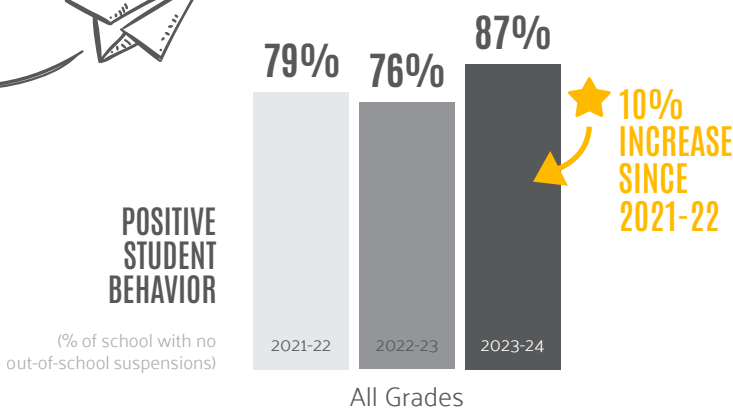

★ SPOTLIGHT

Raub shifted its disciplinary approach toward restorative practices, healing circles and alternatives to suspension consequences, resulting in positive behavior improvements.

Community School strategies that support social-emotional wellness and positive culture and climate:

- Adoption of a trauma-informed schools approach
- Restorative practices
- Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports
- School climate survey
- Emphasis on staff wellness and teacher self-care
- Referrals to community-based mental health supports
- Positive attendance campaign
- On-site social worker or case manager

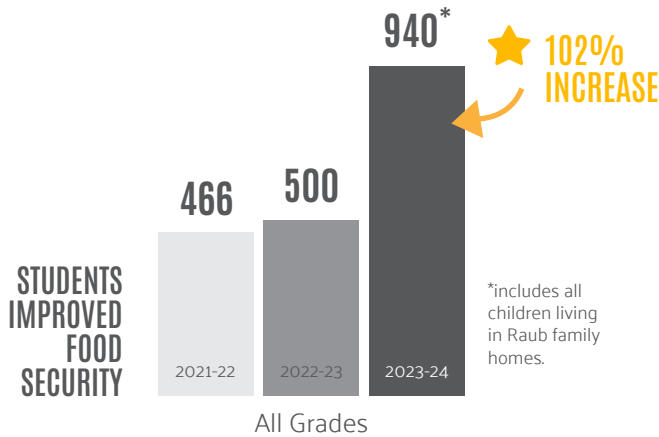
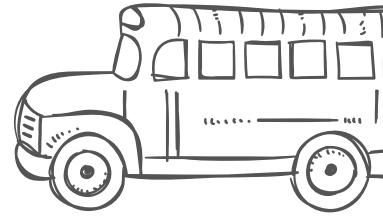
INCREASED CONNECTIONS TO FOOD, HOUSING AND FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

Raub opened a new school-based food pantry in January 2024, allowing Raub to better serve students and families, increase the amount and quality of food and connect families to other resources.

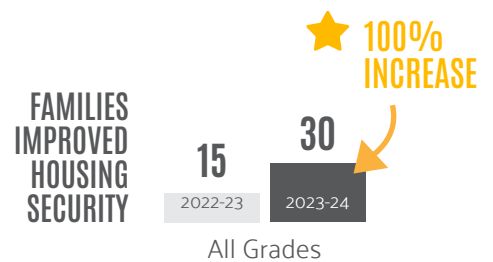
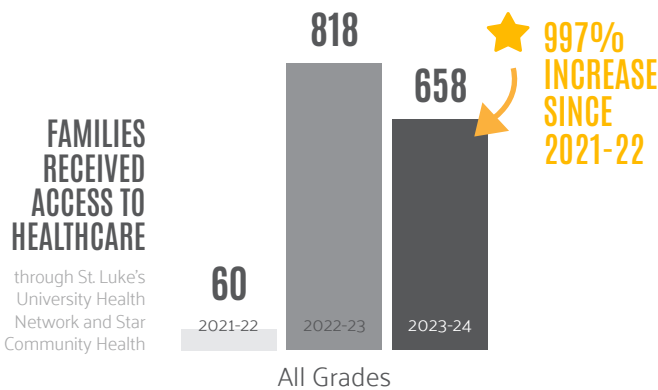
As a result, the food pantry has served:
