BUILDING AN AGE-FRIENDLY LEHIGH VALLEY

EXPANDING SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE WITH DEMENTIA AND THEIR CAREGIVERS



Adult day services for older adults provide socialization and engagement in a safe and supervised environment, while giving caregivers some respite from the demands of care giving and often delaying nursing home placement.

25,000 PEOPLE IN THE LEHIGH VALLEY ARE LIVING WITH ALZHEIMER'S AND DEMENTIA ESTIMATED 75,000 BY 2050

As the population of the Greater Lehigh Valley ages, more people are living with or caring for someone with Alzheimer's or dementia. By 2050, estimates suggest it will impact as many as one in 10 people in our region, impacting healthcare systems, workers, communities, families and patients.

"Most importantly, it impacts quality of life for people living with dementia and their caregivers. At United Way and Age-Friendly Lehigh Valley, we strive to connect older adults with the resources they need to improve their health and well-being, so that they can remain in the community, stay engaged and thrive in day-to-day living," said Carmen Bell, United Way Senior Director of Healthy Aging.

With support from the Fleming Foundation and donors like you, United Way has expanded investments that help improve the lives of Lehigh Valley residents who have Alzheimer's and dementia and for those who care for them. Funded initiatives focus on:

- Decreasing stigma
- Increasing opportunities for meaningful social interaction
- Increasing early diagnosis
- · Addressing the changing needs of people living with dementia



Project Lifesaver is a searchand-rescue program that ensures individuals with dementia who are prone to wandering can be located and brought home safely, giving families and caregivers peace of mind that their loved ones will be found quickly.



Savvy Caregiver helps caregivers learn strategies to enhance their day-to-day time with their person living with dementia, while decreasing their stress, burden and depression and increasing their sense of competence and confidence in their care role.
