RECOGNIZED AS NATIONAL COMMUNITY SCHOOL MODEL

Executive Secretary Dr. Deborah Carrera and Special Assistant to the Secretary of Education Dr. Nikole Hollins-Sims from the Pennsylvania Department of Education visited Broughal Middle School to learn more about best practices within the Community School model. U.S. Congresswoman Susan Wild also visited the school to discuss strategies for supporting powerful learning, integrated health and social supports and authentic family and community engagement.

IMPROVED HOUSING SECURITY FOR FAMILIES

Broughal Middle School improved access to housing assistance through a pilot program for South Bethlehem Community Schools in partnership with United Way and New Bethany Ministries. The pilot program provided support for a part-time, on-site housing advocate to work directly with a growing number of families struggling with paying rent and facing eviction notices. Through the program, 100% of families maintained stable housing and avoided homelessness or eviction.

IMPROVED SCHOOL CULTURE AND CLIMATE

Broughal Middle School increased a positive culture and climate within the school building by expanding their school-wide social-emotional learning (SEL), restorative practices and positive behavior support. In partnership with the other Community Schools, Broughal celebrated SEL Day with a week-long celebration and a highlight compilation video providing tips and activities. During the week, they treated staff to a morning pick-me-up, organized brain breaks for students and allowed time during lunches for students to write kind notes to their peers and teachers.
