PROVIDED MINDFULNESS RESOURCES FOR STUDENTS AND TEACHERS

Through the Shanthi Mindfulness Program, Donegan Elementary integrated mindfulness teaching in every classroom. In addition, the school partnered with Air Products, Bethlehem Area School District Foundation and Shanthi Project to create a dedicated "zen zone" for staff and classroom "zen zones" for students.

IMPROVED HOUSING SECURITY FOR FAMILIES

Donegan Elementary improved access to housing assistance through a pilot program for South Bethlehem Community Schools in partnership with United Way and New Bethany Ministries. The pilot program provided support for a part-time, on-site housing advocate to work directly with a growing number of families struggling with paying rent and facing eviction notices. Through the program, 17 Donegan families received housing assistance and 100% avoided homelessness or eviction.
