

INCREASED FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Paxinosa Elementary School surpassed its goals for parent and family engagement. Creating events in which families can attend and have some one-on-one conversations with the school staff has proven to report the highest number of families attending. Additionally, Paxinosa engaged families in bringing new programs to the school for adults. They partnered with Lafayette College and created a fall and spring program in which parents learned conversational English as well as some important life skills.
