



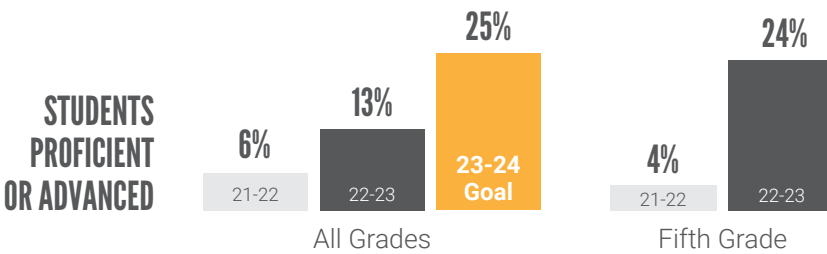

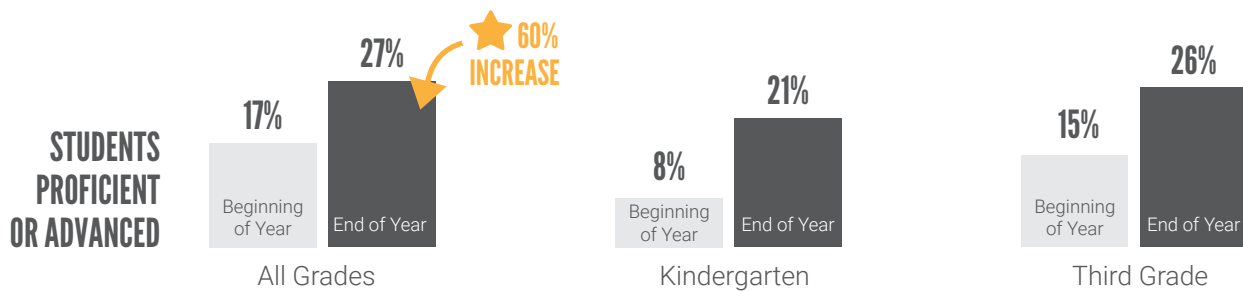

ACADEMIC GROWTH ACROSS EVERY GRADE LEVEL



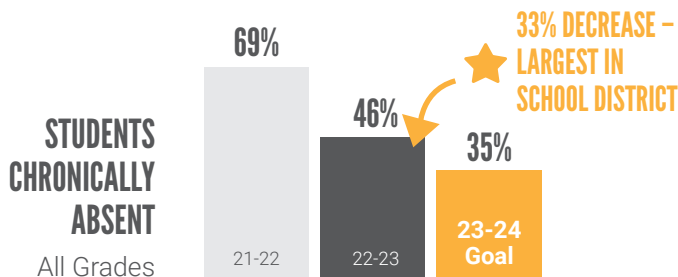

(missing 10% or more days per year)

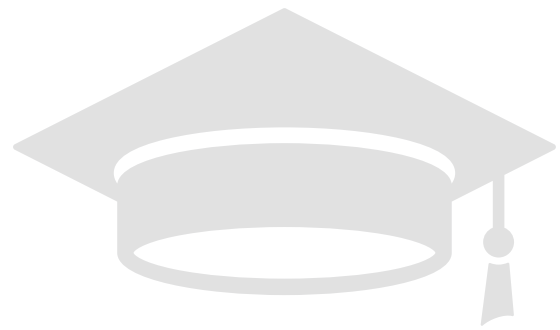


KEYS TO SUCCESS:

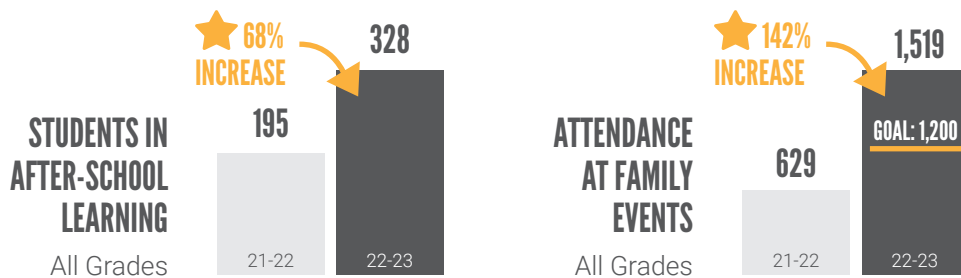
INCREASED EARLY EDUCATION PROGRAMMING
