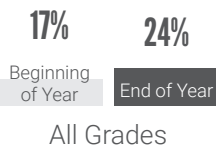

Students receive **tutoring** 4-5 days per week through the 21st Century Community Learning Centers grant and El Sistema Lehigh Valley.

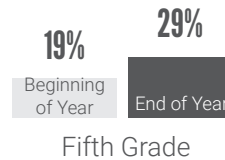
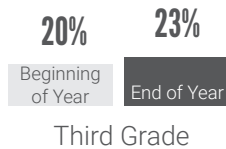
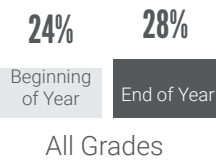

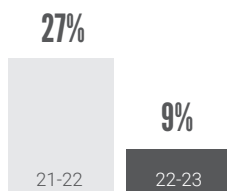
STUDENT ATTENDANCE

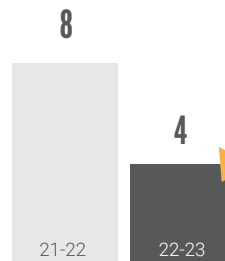

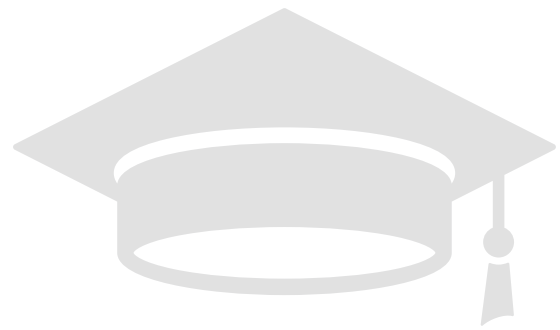

60% of the 171 students identified through the Student Assistance Program as needing **behavioral health supports** were connected with interventions

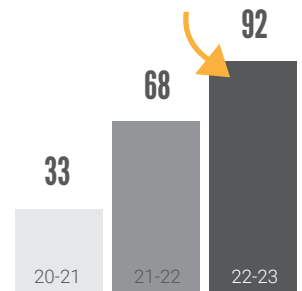

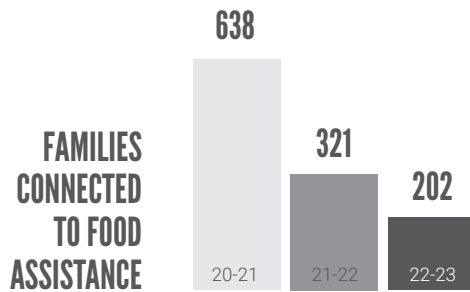

FAMILY STABILITY

STRENGTHENED WITH FEWER REFERRALS

Fewer referrals to food, housing and financial supports, in combination with decreased chronic absenteeism, suggest that Roosevelt families may be experiencing **greater financial stability**.



In 2022-23, Roosevelt had an **on-site food bank** for students, run by the Community School Coordinator. Teachers referred students and at the end of the day, students stopped by the food bank for a bag of food to take home with them. A partnership with Nativity Church helped to provide additional meal kits for families.
