





📌 SPOTLIGHT: RAUB MIDDLE SCHOOL

Raub tripled participation in parent-teacher conferences (300 families).

📌 SPOTLIGHT: PAXINOSA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Paxinosa increased participation in **after-school enrichment programming** to 70% (265 to 426 students).
